We're also scheduling Passover, Shavuot, and Rosh Hashanah with the leadership of Rabbi Jackie.

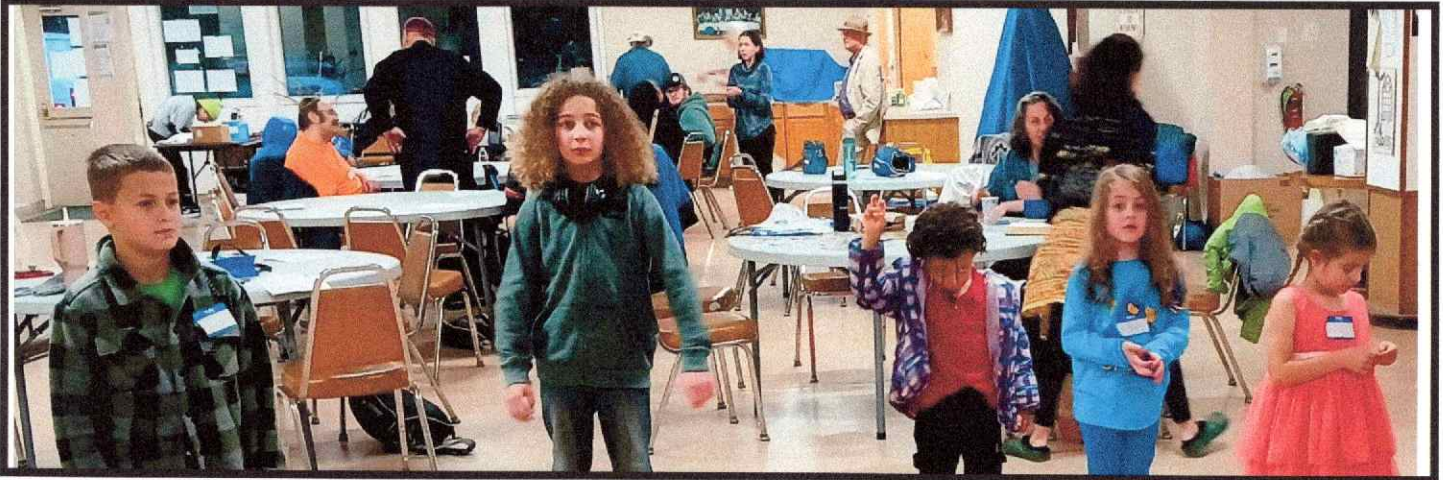
We will be having our picnic later in the summer and we're working on a couple of lay-led Shabbats.

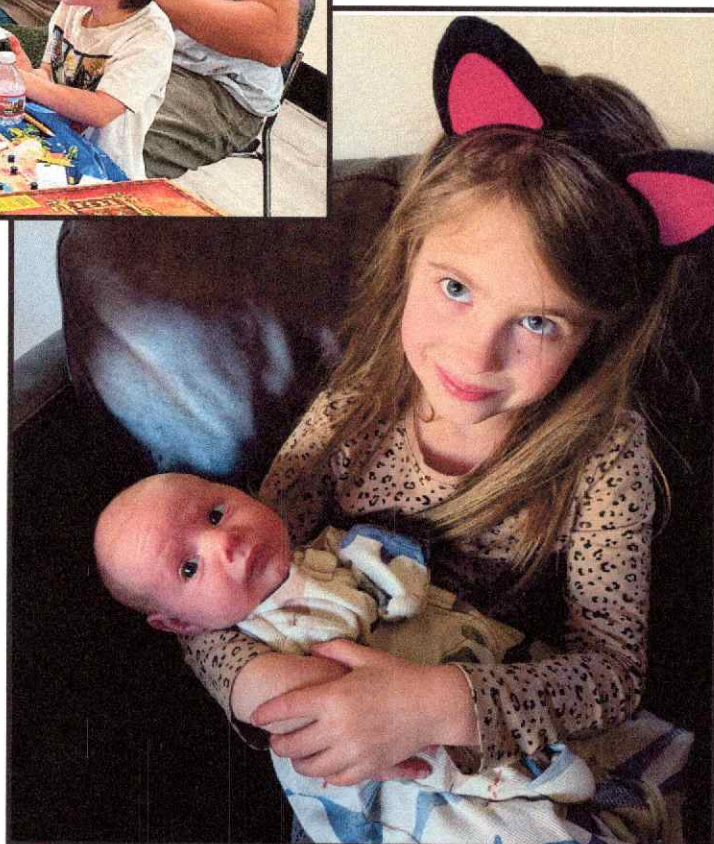


Above: Jewish children learn about their heritage at our Sunday school. Photo: Rae Lea Cousens.

Shalom of Safed

Shalom Moskovitz was born in Safed, c 1887. He was Hasidic and influenced by mystical tradition of the Cabbala that, like Moskovitz, had its home in Safed.

He earned a living as a watchmaker and was commonly referred to by that name - "Zeigermacher" in Yiddish.

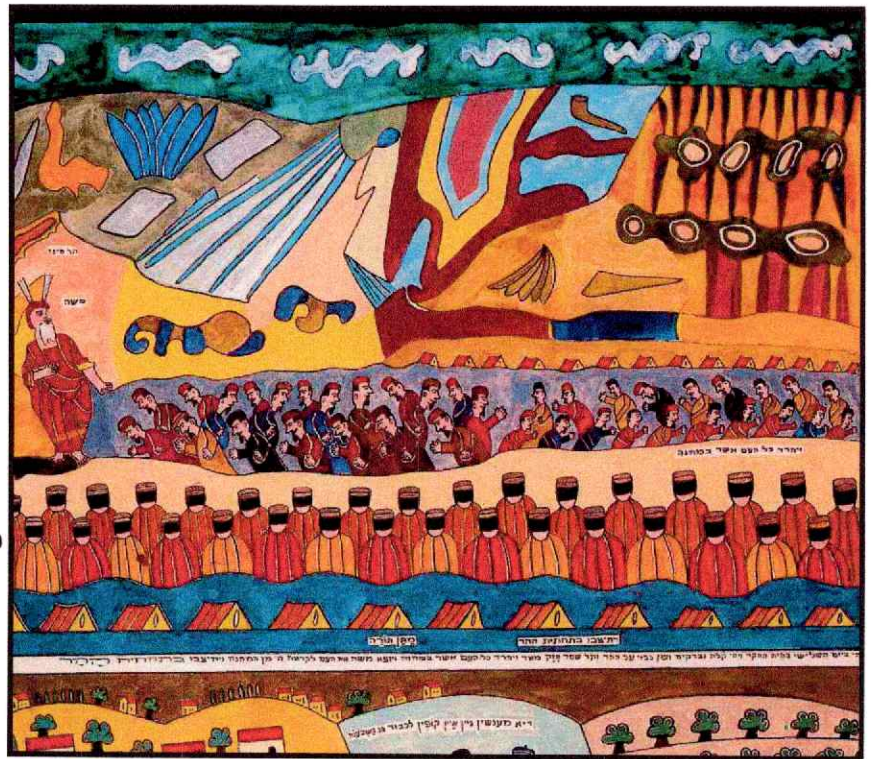
During the 1948 war his workshop was destroyed. This forced him to try earning a living making toys from plywood.

In the 1950s, painter Yosl Bergner was impressed with the craftsmanship of Shalom's wood toys and encouraged him to try painting.

Moskovitz continued to live and paint in the city of Safed until his death in 1980.

He was a naïve artist. He painted in the primitive style, expressing biblical themes. He also designed stained-glass windows and was an accomplished practitioner of microcalligraphy.
